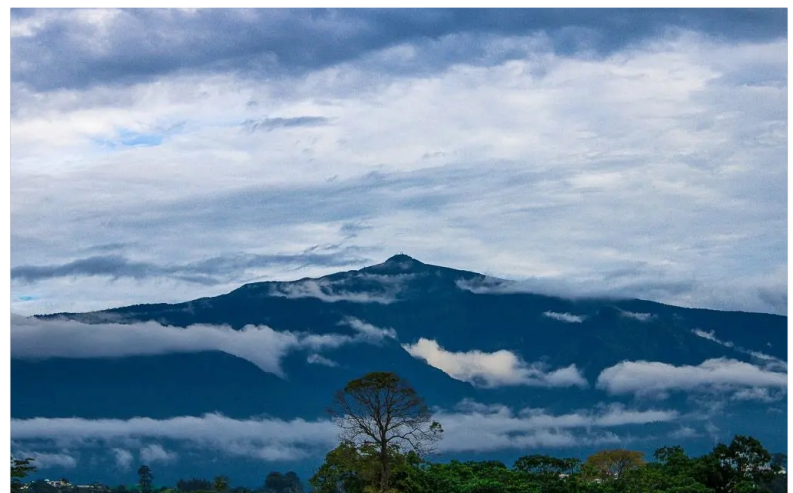
Meetings
